Only those regulations published by the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen in its Official Bulletins are legally binding. Any claims to rights or titles resulting from the English translation of these regulations are expressly excluded.

Faculty of Economic Sciences:

Following the resolutions of the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Economic Sciences dated 28.06.2023, the Senate of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen approved the fifth bye-law for amendment of the regulations concerning the qualifications for entry and admission to the Master's degree programmes of the Faculty of Economic Sciences on 06.09.2023; the amendments are deemed to have been approved on the basis of a resolution of the Foundation Committee University of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen, Foundation under Public Law of 10.07.2019 (§ 44 section 1 sentence 2 NHG in the version of the announcement dated 26.02.2007 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 69), last amended by Article 7 of the Act dated 23.03.2022 (Nds. GVBI. p. 218); § 41 section 1 sentence 1 NHG in conjunction with § 18 section 6 sentence 3, section 8, sentence 4 NHG and § 7 section 1 sentence 1 NHZG in the version of the announcement dated 29.01.1998 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 333); §§ 62 section 4 sentence 1, 60 a section 1 sentence 1 NHZG).

Regulation concerning the qualifications for entry and admission for the consecutive Master's degree programme "Development Economics" at the University of Göttingen

I. Scope

§ 1 Scope

(1) These regulations govern the entry and admission to the consecutive Master's degree programme "Development Economics".

(2) The University executes an autonomous procedure for assessing the entry qualifications for all university places to be awarded in the consecutive Master's degree programme "Development Economics" in accordance with the following provisions.

(3) ¹If the number of applicants who meet the qualifications for entry exceeds the available places, the university awards the places based on the results of its own selection procedure.

²If the number of applicants who meet the qualifications for entry falls short of the available places, a selection procedure does not take place.

II. Authorisation for entry

§ 2 Qualifications for entry

(1) ¹Applicants seeking admission to the Master's degree programme must demonstrate professional aptitude.² Professional aptitude is present, if the person has completed at least a six semester technically relevant course of study with a Bachelor degree to the extent of at least 180 ECTS credits or with an equivalent degree in a course of study at a German college or a college, which is from one of the Bologna Signatory States, as per section 2 in the course of study Macroeconomics, Economic Sciences, Agricultural Economics or in a subject area which is technically related. ³Final examinations which have been passed in a country outside the Bologna Signatory State, require assessment of equivalence for the degrees as per sentence 2 considering the recommendations by the Central Office for Foreign Education (ZAB) at the office of the permanent conference of the federal ministers of cultural affairs in Federal Republic of Germany (KMK) for the accreditation and assessment of foreign proof of academic qualification should be converted to the German grading system.

(2) ¹Notwithstanding section 1, eligibility will be considered proven by applicants who have not yet completed a course of studies at the time of application, but have acquired at least 150 credits in a relevant Bachelor's degree programme as stated in section 3 or in an equivalent degree programme. ²The average grade calculated from the previous examination components is also considered in the selection procedure instead of the bachelor grade or the grade of an equivalent proof of academic qualification, irrespective of whether the result of the Bachelor's examination deviates therefrom.

(3) ¹The decision whether an undergraduate programme is relevant in the meaning of sections
1 to 2 is made by the selection committee. ²Requirement for subject relevance of the undergraduate degree is the proof of at least the following components:

- ca) Components in Macroeconomics and/or Agricultural Economics and/or Econometrics with a rating of at least 60 credits, including components in Theory of Economics, Agricultural Economics and Development Economics with a total rating of at least 30 credits, again including at least 18 credits from modules with middle or high academic level, as well as in addition
- b) components in Mathematics or Statistics or Econometrics with a total rating of at least 12 credits.

³Subject relevance is assessed on the basis of the documents to be submitted along with the application as well as suitable criteria, especially based on module descriptions, from which follow teaching and examination contents, and based on the used literature, the module prerequisites, the study and examination regulations and the sample curriculums of the degree programme, in which the component was accomplished. ⁴Insofar as fewer persons apply who satisfy all qualifications for entry according to sentence 2 than there are university places to be awarded, the selection committee may require the completion of pending examination components under sentence 2 within two semesters for assessing the subject relevance; in this case, assessment of subject relevance and the entry is subject to termination until proof of the pending examination components, which should be submitted within two semesters from the time of enrolment at the university (closing date). ⁵If the proof of the pending examination components is not submitted within the deadline, the assessment of the subject relevance and a related letter of admission will become ineffective. ⁶The assessment of the subject relevance is omitted if the components under line 2 that have not been accomplished yet have a rating of more than 15 credits.

(4) ¹Applicants whose native language is not English must show very good English language skills. ²Very good English language skills must be demonstrated with standardised or accredited certificates at minimum C1 level in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) or comparable achievements; the following shall serve as proof:

a) a proof of academic achievement for at least one Business English course at level C1 from an accredited university;

b) Cambridge English Scale: min. 180 points;

c) International English Language Testing System (IELTS Academic): min. band 7.0;

d) Test of English as a Foreign Language, internet-based test (TOEFL iBT): min. 95 points;

e) Global Scale of English (Pearson Academic): min. 76 points;

f) UNIcert®: min. certificate UNIcert® III;

g) NULTE certificate: min. level C1: Acert (Poland), CertACLES (Spain), CLES (France), UNIcert®LUCE (Czech Republic and Slovakia), UNI-LANG (United Kingdom). *Network of University Language Testers in Europe

³Other certificates according to the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages" (CEFR) can be admitted by the selection committee after a professional statement by the Central Institution for Languages and Key Qualifications (ZESS) of the University of Göttingen.

⁴Successful completion of the tests may not be more than three years before submission of the application for admission to the Master's degree programme. ⁵Exempt from the obligation to provide proof of a test are applicants who can provide evidence of

a) two years spent studying at school / university or working abroad in an Englishspeaking country, not earlier than five years before submission of the application for admission,

b) the successful completion of a degree programme taught entirely in English or

c) education that was acquired at a school with English as the medium of instruction and is equivalent to the German university entrance qualification.

(5) ¹Moreover, the general provisions of the enrolment regulation of the University of Göttingen for enrolment remain unaffected. ²The enrolment of the applicants, authorised in principle for admission according to section 2, is conditional upon submission of proof of successful completion of the Bachelor's degree programme or an equivalent programme. ³Proof must be submitted by 15 November. ⁴Provided the Dean of Studies determines, on the basis of the periods of studies so far, in particular the present examination components, that the applicant will attain the degree latest up to the end of the first semester of the Master's course of study, the deadline as per sentence 3 is extended up to the end of 31 March; the statement is admissible, provided

a) as for examination results, only the thesis is missing or

b) the thesis was already submitted to the university and the extent of the still missing examination components does not exceed six credits.

III. Selection procedure

§ 3 Start of programme, admissions application, closing date

(1) ¹The Master's degree programme starts with the winter semester. ²The admissions application should be submitted via an online portal; more details will be announced by the university within an appropriate time frame before expiry of the application deadline. ³The application for admission for the Master's degree programme must have been submitted to the university using the forms provided at the online portal, along with the application documents required in accordance with section 2 by 15 May (closing date).⁴The application applies only to the award of university places on the relevant admission date. ⁵The university is not obligated to review the details of the applicants as part of its required duties.

(2) The following documents should be enclosed with the application for admission:

- a) the degree certificate/s of the applicant in German or English; if a degree certificate is not yet present, a certificate (with verification code or attestation of the issuing institution) regarding the acquired examination components, the credits and the average grade should be submitted;
- b) a personal data sheet written in English with a meaningful description of the educational career;
- c) Proof of very good English language proficiency according to § 2 section 4;
- d) A declaration, whether the applicant has successfully / unsuccessfully completed a Master degree programme in a similar discipline or has not completed it yet;
- e) An account in English, which shows the motivation of the applicant for accepting this degree programme / research interest as well as relevant academic work so far, relevant internships or professional experience;
- f) transcripts from the Module Handbook or other documents, based on which the credits can be reviewed in accordance with § 2 section 3.

²Documents in accordance with letters a) and c) must be submitted upon request of the university in the original or as certified copies in German or English.

(3) ¹Applications that are not submitted complete, or in due form and time, shall be excluded from the further procedure. ²The documents submitted remain with the university.

(4) If a prospective student establishes that he or she is disadvantaged in the selection procedure with respect to other applicants due to a handicap, a suitable compensation of disadvantage is to be granted by the Selection Committee upon request.

§ 4 Selection Committee for the Master's degree programme

(1) For processing the selection decision, the Faculty of Economic Sciences and the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences form at least one Selection Committee for this degree programme.

(2) ¹A selection committee is comprised of three members eligible to vote, who belong to the scientific personnel working full-time or the professoral group, and a member of the student union with advisory vote. ²At least one member must belong to the professoral group of the Faculty of Economic Sciences and at least one member shall belong to the professoral group of the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences. ³The members are appointed by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Economic Sciences. ⁴The period in office of the members is two years, while that of the student member is one year. ⁵Reappointment is possible. ⁶The selection committee holds a quorum if at least two members eligible to vote are present.

(3) The tasks of the selection committee are:

- a) Review of the incoming admissions applications for formal correctness
- b) Review and assessment of the admission requirements, if necessary
- c) Conducting the interviews in accordance with § 8
- d) decision on the admission or rejection of the applicant.

(4) The Selection Committee reports to the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Economic Sciences about the experience gathered and submits any suggestions for further development of the award procedure, after conclusion of the award procedure.

§ 5 Sequence of the selection procedure

(1) A selection procedure includes the award of university places related to the specific admission date.

(2) ¹The admissions applications are decided in a main procedure and in the procedure for subsequent admissions, if required. ²In the first step of the main procedure, the university places will be awarded at first to the applicants entitled to admission with outstanding suitability (best quota; § 6) and then the applicants entitled to admission according to combination of several criteria (combination quota; § 7).

(3) ¹Anyone who has been awarded admission in the best quota will not participate in the combination quota of the selection procedure. ²Anyone who has been awarded admission in the best quota or the combination quota, will not participate in a procedure for subsequent admissions.

(4) The selection committee can consider in the event of an overbooking that some university places may not be accepted.

(5) The remaining university places from the best quota are included in the combination quota.

(6) ¹Notwithstanding, the general provisions of the enrolment regulation of the university for enrolment remain unaffected. ²The admission of the applicants, authorised in principle for admission according to § 2 section 2, is conditional upon submission of proof of successful completion of the Bachelor's degree programme or an equivalent degree programme. ³Proof must be submitted by 15 November. ⁴ Provided the dean determines, on the basis of the periods of studies so far, in particular the present examination components, that the applicant will attain the degree latest up to the end of the first semester of the Master course of study, the deadline as per sentence 3 is extended up to the end of 31 March; the statement is admissible, provided

a) as for examination results, only the thesis is missing or

b) the thesis was already submitted to the university and the extent of the still missing examination components does not exceed six credits.

§ 6 Best quota

(1) ¹For the selection as part of the best quota, a ranking list is generated in accordance with the provisions under section 2. ²70% of the university places are awarded according to the ranking list, beginning with place 1. ³In case of identical ranking, the ranking is determined according to the result of the bachelor degree or an equivalent degree; apart from this, a draw will decide the outcome in case of identical ranking.

(2) For generation of the ranking list, a points scheme with which a maximum of 86 points are attainable is used.

a) According to the result of the bachelor grade or the grade of an equivalent degree, points are awarded to the applicant as follows:

over 2.6 up to and including 2.7	24 points,
over 2.7 up to and including 2.8	23 points,
over 2.8 up to and including 2.9	22 points,
over 2.9 up to and including 3.0	21 points,
over 3.0 up to and including 3.1	19 points,

over 3.1 up to and including 3.2	17 points,
over 3.2 up to and including 3.3	15 points,
over 3.3 up to and including 3.4	13 points,
over 3.4 up to and including 3.5	11 points,
over 3.5 up to and including 3.6	9 points,
over 3.6 up to and including 3.7	7 points,
over 3.7 up to and including 3.8	5 points,
over 3.8 up to and including 3.9	3 points,
over 3.9 up to and including 4.0	1 point.

- b) For specialised knowledge in Theory of Economics, Agricultural Economics and Development Economics with a rating of a total of at least 30 credits, maximum of 30 points are awarded in accordance with the following provisions; the components to be considered should be specified by the applicant:
 - ba) In case of credits in modules with high scientific level, the credits acquired through successful completion of these modules are multiplied by 1.0 points.
 - bb) In case of credits in modules with average scientific level, the credits acquired through successful completion of these modules are multiplied by 0.5 points.
 - bc) the sums resulting from the respective multiplication are added.
 - bd) for credits in modules with low scientific level, no points are awarded.
- c) On the basis of the written account by the applicant, which shows the motivation of the applicant for accepting this degree programme / research interest as well as relevant academic work so far, relevant internships or professional experience; maximum 5 points are credited as per the following provisions:

The motivation and experience so far are

- excellent 5 points,
- very convincing 4 points,
- convincing 3 points,
- not very convincing 2 points,
- hardly convincing 1 point,
- not convincing 0 points.

d) The points attained under letters a) to c) are added.

(3) ¹Applicants, who can be admitted as part of the best quota, receive a letter of admission from the university in text form. ²This letter specifies the deadline, within which the applicant should enrol or declare in text form, whether he or she accepts the university place. ³The applicant must enrol at the latest two weeks after expiry of the deadline mentioned in sentence

2 (closing date), provided no enrolment according to sentence 2 has been made. ⁴If the university does not have

a) the enrolment under sentence 2 or

b) the declaration under sentence 2 and the enrolment under sentence 3

within the specified deadline and in the correct form, the letter of admission will become ineffective. ⁵These legal consequences must be pointed out in the letter of admission.

(4) The admitted students do not take part in the further procedure any longer.

§ 7 Combination quota

(1) For the selection as part of the combination quota, a ranking list is generated in accordance with the following provisions. 30% of the university places are awarded according to the ranking list, beginning with place 1.

- (2) The selection is made on the basis of a combination of the following criteria:
- a) based on a ranking list, which is generated according to the procedure under § 6 section2, and
- b) according to the result of an interview with the applicant.

(3) The selection committee screens the received applications according to section 4 and selects from the screened applicants on the basis of the selection criteria mentioned in sections 2 and 5.

(4)¹The received applications are screened at least to twice the number of university places to be awarded as per the selection procedure within the framework of the combination quota for limitation of the number of participants for the interview. ²A ranking list is generated for this purpose in accordance with this procedure under § 6 section 2. ³In the event of an identical ranking, all applicants in the highest ranking will be permitted to participate.

(5) ¹The selection is made on the basis of a ranking list, with which a maximum of 100 points are attainable.²This is generated in accordance with the following provisions:

a) Points are awarded to the applicant as follows (maximum 14 points), depending on the assessment of the degree of suitability in the interview:

The applicant isvery suitable10 up to and including 14 pointssuitable5 up to and including 9 points

less suitable1 up to and including 4 pointsbarely suitable0 points.

b) Points are awarded to the applicant in accordance with the procedure under § 6 section2 (maximum 86 points).

c) The points attained under points a) and b) are added.

(6) ¹If there is identical ranking after generating the ranking list, the ranking sequence is determined based on the result of the points attained according to section 5 sentence 2 letter b), thereupon according to the result of the bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. ²A draw shall be held to decide the outcome in all other cases in which there is identical ranking.

(7) The selected applicants are admitted under § 9.

§ 8 Interview

(1) ¹The interview should show whether the applicant is suitable for the selected degree programme. ²The following principles apply to the execution of the interview:

- a) the interview is normally held during the month of June at the university on-site or digitally. The exact date as well as the place are announced within an appropriate period before start of the interviews by the university. The university invites the candidates to the interview with sufficient notice.
- b) The selection committee conducts an interview lasting about 15 minutes with every applicant. The interview can be held simultaneously for up to four applicants.
- c) Minutes are kept of the essential questions and answers within the interview; said minutes must be signed by the members of the selection committee. The minutes should clearly show the day and place of the interview, the name of the committee members, the name of the applicant and the assessment.

(2) The interview extends to the motivation of the applicant as well as the following suitability parameters:

- a) capability for scientific and / or principle and method-oriented way of working,
- b) Previous experience and established knowledge of the scientific principles in the field of Theory of Economics, Agricultural Economics and Development Economics that were acquired as part of the degree programme upon which the application is based and are proven by documents,

- c) Clear-cut idea of the study contents of this degree programme,
- d) Professional and personal goals,
- e) extracurricular interests relevant to the degree programme.

(3) The members of the selection committee assess the applicant after conclusion of the interview to ascertain suitability for the selected degree programme on a scale according to § 7 section 5 sentence 2 letter a).

(4) ¹An applicant who fails to attend the interview without good cause is excluded from the further procedure. ²The selection committee schedules a new date for the interview upon request, if there is due cause. ³The important reason and application for rescheduling a new date should be shown or made promptly, at the latest within two days after the date first scheduled by the selection committee. ⁴An excluded applicant is entitled to participate in the next selection procedure once again.

§ 9 Letter of admission, rejection letter and procedure for subsequent admissions

(1) ¹Applicants who can be admitted as part of the combination quota receive a letter of admission from the university in text form. ²This letter specifies the deadline, within which the applicant should enrol or declare in text form, whether he or she accepts the university place. ³The applicant must enrol at the latest two weeks after expiry of the deadline mentioned in sentence 2 (closing date), provided no enrolment according to sentence 2 has been made. ⁴If the university does not have

- a) the enrolment under sentence 2 or
- b) the declaration under sentence 2 and the enrolment under sentence 3

within the specified deadline and in the correct form, the letter of admission will become ineffective. ⁵These legal consequences must be pointed out in the letter of admission.

(2) ¹Applicants, who cannot be admitted in the combination quota, receive a rejection letter, in which the attained ranking and the ranking of the applicant last admitted are mentioned. ²The rejection letter provides information on rights of legal recourse. ³Insofar as the applicant has satisfied the requirements for entry, it also includes the request to declare in text form within a specified deadline whether the admissions application will be held for a procedure for subsequent admissions. ⁴If the applicant does not submit this declaration within a specified or in the correct form, he or she will be excluded from the procedure for subsequent admissions. ⁵Reference must be made to this legal consequence.

(3) ¹The procedure for subsequent admissions will be executed on the basis of the ranking list according to § 7 sections 5 and 6. ²If the ranking list according to sentence 1 is exhausted, a ranking list is generated according to the provisions of § 6 section 2 and the procedure for subsequent admissions is carried out on the basis of this ranking list. ³In case of identical ranking after generation of a ranking list, the ranking order is determined according to the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. ⁴A lottery shall in all cases thereafter decide the outcome in the event of identical ranking. ⁵The provisions of the section 1 apply correspondingly.

(4) ¹The selection procedures are completed at the latest on 15 November. ²University places that are still remaining will be awarded by a draw to applicants entitled to admission, without any formal application. ³The application period for this begins two weeks before start of the semester, for which the admission should be made, and ends with the completion of the selection procedure; the provisions of the § 2 section 1 and 3 to 5 apply correspondingly. ⁴The award of university places by means of a lottery is completed no later than 30 November, because of the advanced lecture period.

§ 9a Quota

(1) ¹A special quota of 33 per cent of the admission number for this degree programme shall be allocated in advance for the admission of foreign nationals and stateless persons with a recognized certificate of previous education who are neither equivalent to Germans according to legal regulations nor nationals of another member state of the European Union or of another state party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area nor have acquired their Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree at a German higher education institution or at a higher education institution of another member state of the European Union or of another state party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area. ²Applications from foreign nationals and stateless persons within the meaning of sentence 1 shall not be considered in the selection procedure pursuant to § 6.

(2) ¹The selection shall be made in accordance with the provisions of §§ 1 to 8, unless otherwise stipulated below. ²The selection committee may take into account special circumstances that speak in favor of studying at a German university by awarding a total of up to 10 additional points. ³Such a circumstance shall be considered in particular if the applicant

- a) demonstrates the award of a scholarship by a publicly funded institution,
- b) has successfully attended a college at the suggestion of a university in Lower Saxony and is registered for a study place,
- c) enjoys the right of asylum in the Federal Republic of Germany,

d) belongs to a German-speaking minority abroad or is subject to funding by intergovernmental treaties or higher education agreements.

(3) In deviation from section 2 sentence 1 as well as § 4 section 1 sentence 2, the application for admission to the Master's degree programme together with the application documents required in accordance with § 4 section 2 must be received by the university by November 15 of the previous year (cut-off deadline) for the winter semester.

(4) Available study places according to this quota shall be added to the quota for the selection procedure according to § 6.

(5) Selection interviews under this quota shall normally be held during the month of January.

§ 9b Hardship quota

(1) A special quota of 1.5 per cent of the number of admissions to this degree programme is formed in advance for cases of exceptional hardship (hardship quota), but at least in the amount of one study place.

(2) ¹The study places within the hardship quota are allocated on application to applicants who fulfil the admission requirements and for whom non-admission to this degree programme would mean exceptional hardship. ²Exceptional hardship exists if special social or family reasons in the applicant's person make immediate admission to the degree programme absolutely necessary. ³Exceptional hardship includes in particular:

a) Caring for a child within the meaning of Section 25 (5) BAföG who has not yet reached the age of 14 at the start of the Master's degree programme,

b) Disability or serious illness,

c) care of a close relative in need of care according to an expert opinion of the medical service of the health insurance.

⁴The degree of exceptional hardship is assessed as follows: The applicant has

-	more than one reason according to sentences 2 and 3 or a reason in	n a particularly
	serious case	3 points

- one reason according to sentences 2 and 3 in a serious case 2 points
- one reason according to sentences 2 and 3 1 point.

(3) ¹The ranking is determined by the degree of exceptional hardship, whereby only applicants who have achieved at least 1 point in accordance with section 2 sentence 4 will be considered. ²If there is a tie after the ranking list has been drawn up, the ranking order shall be determined by the result of the assessment in accordance with Section 6 (2); if there is still a tie, the ranking order shall be determined by the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. ³Otherwise, in the event of a tie, the decision shall be made by lot.

(4) ¹The decision is made by the selection committee. ²The provisions of Section 9 (1) and (2) apply accordingly.

(5) Study places remaining available according to this quota shall be added to the quota for the selection procedure according to § 5.

§ 10 Admission to higher semesters

(1) The free university places in a higher semester with limited admission are awarded to applicants in the following sequence,

a) Who are in the same or a similar degree programme,

aa) are or were enrolled at another German college or a college in another member state of the European Union or another signatory to the agreement on the European Economic Area.

ab) Who are or were enrolled at a foreign university and possess the German nationality or are subject to the same university admissions laws and regulations as German citizens,

b) For whom the rejection of admission for personal reasons would mean extraordinary hardship,

c) Who assert other reasons.

(2) Within each one of the three case groups of the section 1, the result of the Bachelor's examination or an examination equivalent to the Bachelor's examination, thereupon the social, especially family-related and economic reasons that are decisive for the choice of place, and finally the draw in cases that are still identical.

IV. Final provision

§ 11 Entry into Force

(1)¹This regulation enters into force on the day following its announcement in the official announcements I of Georg-August-Universität Göttingen. ²It applies for the first time to the awards procedure in the winter semester 2013/14.

(2) ¹At the same time, the regulations concerning the qualifications for entry and admission to the consecutive Master's degree programme in "Development Economics" in the version contained in the announcement dated 21.04.2011 (official announcements no. 7/2011 p. 395)

shall be rendered ineffective. ² It remains applicable to admission procedures prior to the winter semester 2013/14.
